

All Team ADBA members should have the follow NYX make-up set:

- 3 Eyeshadows
 - *Hollywood* – white shimmer base
 - *Frosted Lilac* – light iridescent purple for lid
 - *Skinny Dip* – darker matte purple for crease
- 1 Blush - *Mocha*
- 1 Lipstick - *Alabama*

Make-Up Application Steps:

1. FOUNDATION:

- a. Apply a liquid or mousse foundation (the same color as the natural skin) to the whole face. Don't forget under the chin and the eyelid (as a base). Remember to blend well into the ears and neckline.

2. EYESHADOW: (refer to images on the right)

- a. (1) Apply the white "Hollywood" shadow to the entire lid of the eye, the under brow, and the tear duct for highlight. Apply 2-3 times for a good cover over the full eye. Don't worry about fallen eyeshadow dust, as we will clean that up later.
- b. (2) Apply the light purple "Frosted Lilac" only to the lid of the eye. From eyelash line to crease. 2-3 times.
- c. (3) Apply the dark purple "Skinny Dip" to the natural crease of the eye. Repeat 2-3 times to leave a nice contrast of color.

3. POWDER & BLUSH:

- a. Gently wipe the face of any fallen eye shadow dust. Especially underneath the eye.
- b. Use a large brush to lightly cover the face in a powder foundation: avoid the eyes. This will set the liquid foundation and prevent smearing.
- c. Apply the pink blush "Mocha" to the cheekbones with a blush brush. Repeat 2-3 times to leave a nice color and be sure to blend well.

4. FINISHING TOUCHES:

- a. Glue on false eyelashes (before you apply the black eyeliner.)
- b. Use black liquid eyeliner on the upper lashes and blend the line of the false lashes. You may use pencil but it is much harder to apply after lashes and if applied before the glue tends to remain visible over the eyeliner.
 - i. Do not apply eyeliner to the inner eye; it causes the eye to look smaller. Above the upper lashes and under the lower lashes only.
- b. Apply black mascara to upper and lower lashes after eyelashes and eyeliner have dried and set.
- c. Finally, add lipstick! Apply once, blot with a tissue folded in half. Apply again and blot. This is a trick I learned years back and it really helps to make the color last long and smudge less!
